Because the amount of the pension depends on duration of employment and the salary



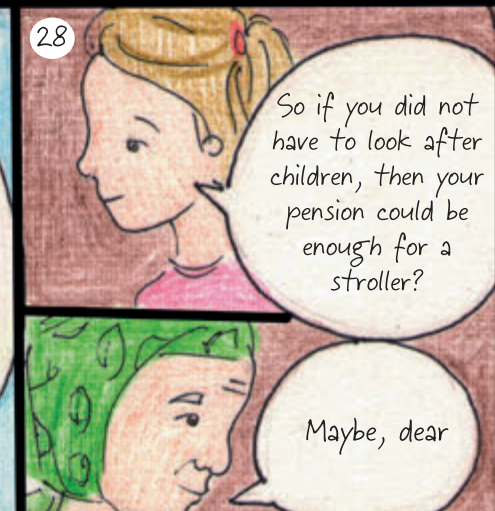
